#### ***From the Winery:***

One of the first known owners of Château Lascombes was the knight Chevalier de Lascombes, who was born in 1625 and inherited it from the Durfort de Duras family. In 1855, Château Lascombes was officially rated as a Second Growth by the 1855 Classification of Medoc wines, commissioned by Napoleon III. Château Lascombes is situated in the northwestern part of the Margaux appellation of the Medoc wine region on the Left Bank of Bordeaux.

Today Château Lascombes is considered one of the largest classified growths of Bordeaux and the largest vineyard of the Margaux appellation. The picturesque, ivy-colored chartreuse style château we see on the property today was originally constructed during the 17th century but went through a series of modifications by the succession of owners.

#### **Appearance:**

An overall typical yet beautiful bottle of Bordeaux, with the winery crest featured on the front label, and the embossing of the Chateau Lascombes on the top shoulder of the bottle. The wine is ruby garnet in color.

#### **Nose:**

Cassis, ripe cherries, ripe black plum and baking spices. Notes of floral elements, lavender and rose petals, with spicy cedar and a bit of that dustiness one gets sometimes when enjoying wine from Bordeaux.

#### **Texture:**

Medium in body and weight. Having that wonderful silky elegance you get from fine Bordeaux wines, especially from the Margaux Appellation, the wine glides through your mouth seamlessly.

#### **Flavor:**

Reflections from the aromatics in the form of cassis, very ripe black cherries, black plum and the baking spices. Add elements of oak, making a sort of sweet and cedar characteristic I find delightful. Follow with notes of earth, tobacco, and stone mineral.

#### **Serving Suggestions:**

The Chevalier de Lascombes will cellar very well for about ten years, making it even smoother and more elegant with time. How could that be, it is so marvelous to drink now! **VALUE!!!**
